
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2474 by Representative Crow, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2474 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2474 would allow an individual who has been a victim of identity theft, including someone who has experienced a security breach of computerized personal or financial information, to place a “security freeze” on his or her credit report. A “security freeze” is a notice placed on a person’s credit report, at the individual’s request, that would prohibit a consumer reporting agency from releasing information from the individual’s report.

The Office of Attorney General estimates that enactment of HB 2474 would not have a fiscal effect.
